Thoughts on Father's Day: THE FATHERHOOD OF GOD

One of the most shocking truths that Jesus taught are the first two words of the Lord's Prayer (Matthew 6:9), "Our Father." God had a fatherly relationship with Israel in the Old Testament, but that was more in the national sense. What Jesus taught in these two words was much more personal and intimate. For those who have been born again through faith in Jesus Christ, we get to have the privilege of calling God "our Father."

All three Persons of the Trinity are involved in bestowing upon believers the privilege of calling God "our Father." We become His adopted sons and daughters through faith in Jesus Christ who died for our sins and rose again. We enter into God's family when we are regenerated (born again) by the Holy Spirit whom Paul refers to as the Spirit of adoption by whom we cry, "Abba! Father!" (Romans 8:15).

As we celebrate and honor our earthly fathers on Father's Day, let us not take for granted one of our greatest privileges—that, because of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ and the regeneration of the Holy Spirit, God is our Father.
